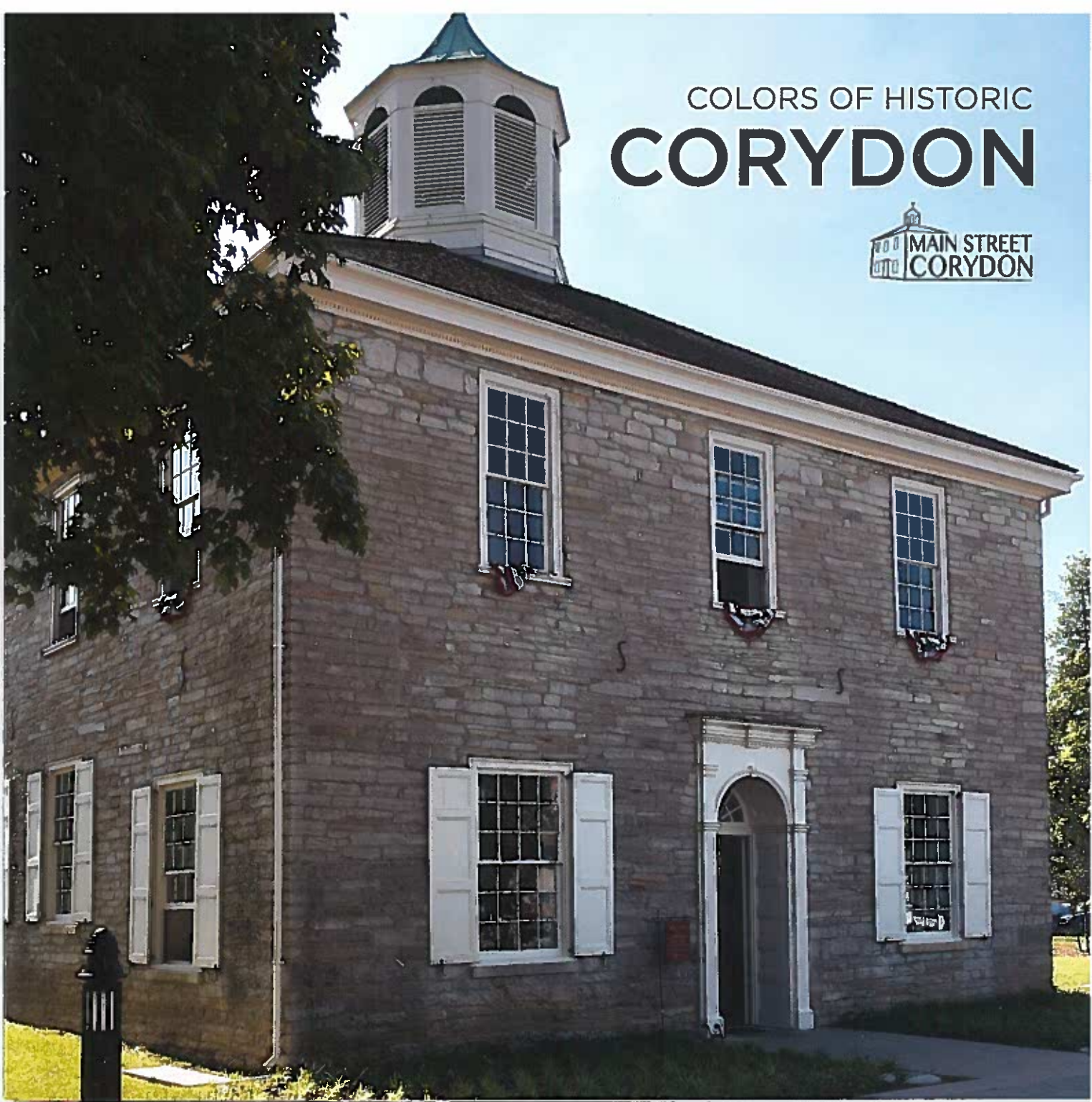

Richly historic Corydon, originally the state capital of Indiana, is a beautiful small town filled with antiquity and charm. The area has deep colonial roots that date back to the battle of Corydon, a small Civil War skirmish. The historic origins of the quaint town have greatly influenced its surrounding architecture. Georgian style columns and dental moldings decorate many of the traditionally colored buildings. Natural elements and neutral colors are also frequent, as brick and stone were common building materials in town. Many of the buildings are uniformly structured with evenly spaced windows and beautiful moldings.

The Historic Colors of Corydon channel the tradition and the natural elements of this charismatic small town. The mild colors compliment the more impactful hues suggested for interior and exterior use. Embrace the culture of Corydon by using historical influences to enhance current contemporary spaces.

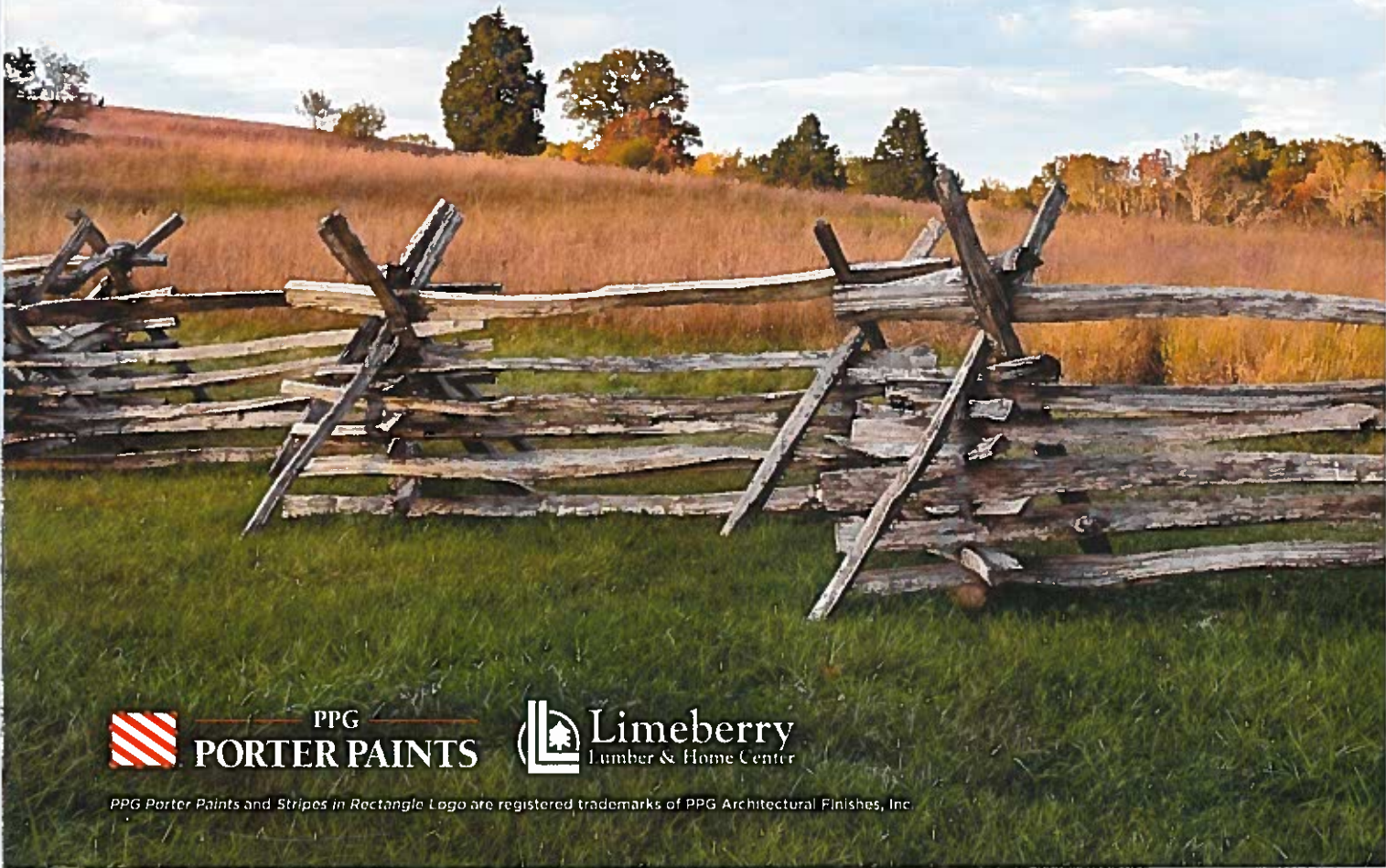


THE HISTORY OF CORYDON

The culture of Corydon and the historical influences are what truly shape the natural elements of the strong history the city gives to all who visit.

In 1808, Corydon was founded and served as the capital of the Indiana Territory from 1813 to 1816. The city was the site of the first constitutional convention back in 1816 and was the site of the battle of Corydon during the American Civil War. During the Civil War, Corydon was the site of the official pitched battle fought in Indiana. There was a famous Constitutional convention that presided in Corydon. President James Madison signed an Enabling Act that provided for the election delegates to a convention at Corydon to consider statehood for Indiana. The Old Capitol building still stands in downtown Corydon as a historic landmark.

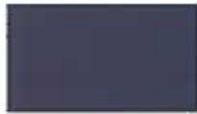
